Toastmaster Leadership Institute

Every six months District 57 organizes several club officers training sessions and others for those interested in learning new skills. They are held in conjunction with club officer elections. The Premier training is the Toastmasters Leadership (TLI). The coming two TLI sessions will be held in July: Pleasant Hill and in Santa Rosa.

The training is conducted by previous officers. The basic materials are from Toastmasters International (TI). Why are these two elements important? The instructors are experienced in the officer role. They typically have a lot of first-hand information to help new officers. The materials from TI are required to give uniformity to the training on a worldwide basis.

However, it is not unusual for the trainer to add in a few items that they feel are important. For instance, when I was a trainer for the role of Secretary, I always emphasized using a written communication and snail mail to contact guests. When a note with a real stamp appears in their mailbox, it is a personal acknowledgement of the club's interest.

Similarly, at the Sergeant-at-Arms (SAA) training, I reminded the SAA to sit a guest next to a current member.

Typically, there will be light breakfast snacks. The schedule includes a Plenary session headed by the District Trio. The attendee will get to know who the District leaders are and hear a common message about the need for trained officers and other topics.

Later, 1-hour breakout sessions will be of the specific officer training. The schedule may also include "enrichment" sessions about related skills.

Volunteering to help at the TLI is encouraged. It is a great way to meet other Toastmasters outside of your club.

Toastmaster Leadership Institute is a way to enhance the Toastmaster experience while preparing to lead your club to success. It is a worthwhile experience.

There are 11 specialized learning paths, including 300 unique competencies, to choose from depending on your interests and goals. These cover a range of topics, so we recommend that it is best to look at them all before making a decision. And, for that, we have a handout that covers them in great detail located in the VP Membership kit.

The full program is intended to be mobile. You can use it on your phone or at home on your computer and is video-based. There are numerous things to watch as they lead you through the path you've chosen.

The process is relatively short from start to finish for each path. TI says that each path might take you a few months. But, it is at your speed. You work on it as you have the time. Then, pick it back up later.

Any of the club officers should be able to help you. Ask us and we will be happy to help.
